Who: Open to all current first year students

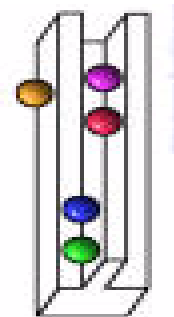

Why: To make Frosh 2004 the best Frosh ever

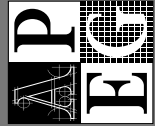

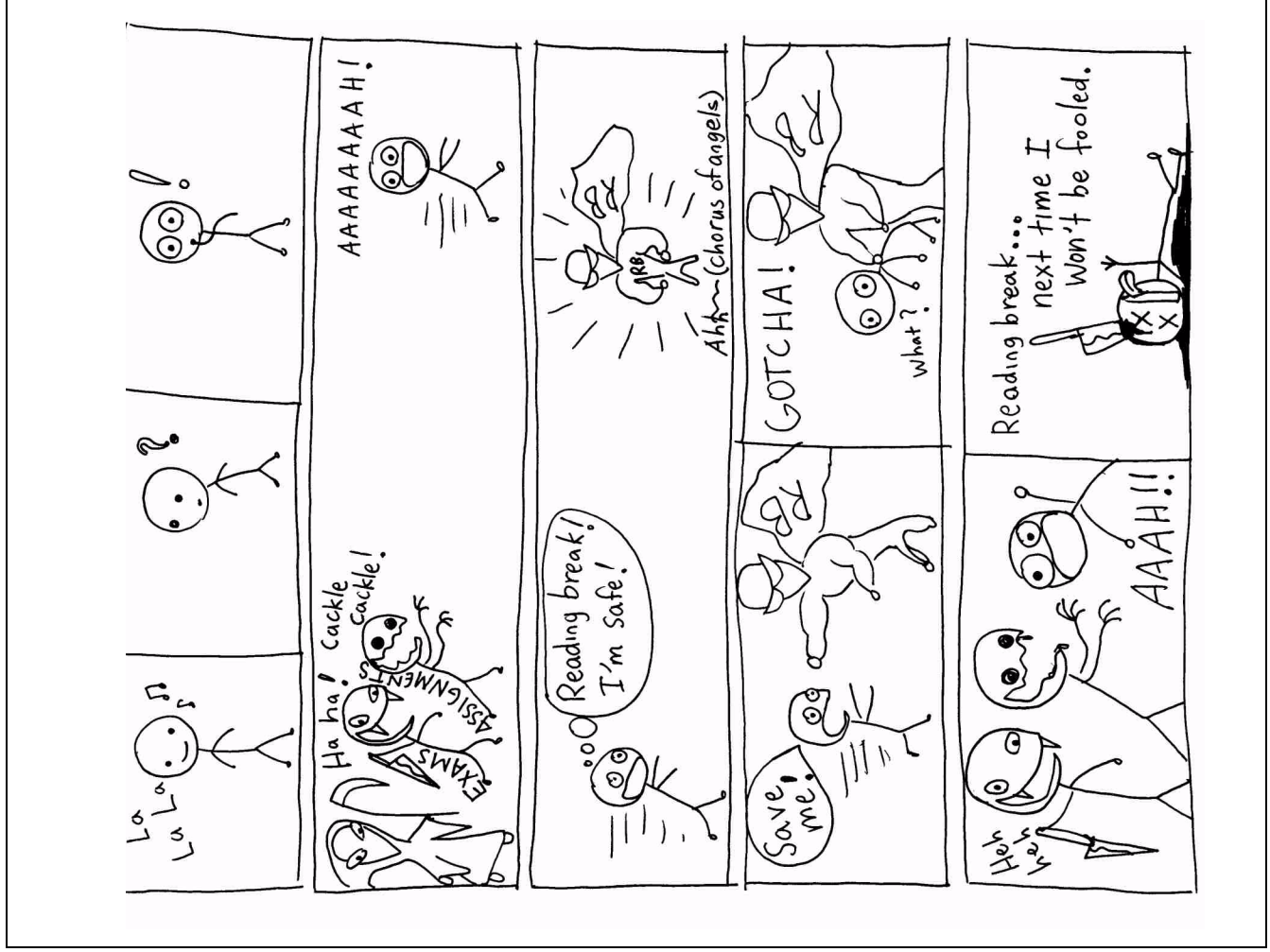
